**Guild Meeting speaker – Charlotte Angotti
Lecture: “Why Aren’t You Making More Quilts? I know You Have the Fabric”**

While shopping with her mother in 1977, Charlotte Angotti wandered into a quilt shop that changed her life. Educated in fine arts, speech, and drama, she brings a variety of talents to the class in a most humorous way. She has been teaching quilting since 1978, and she has enjoyed a national/international teaching career since 1991. It has been said many times that if you hear laughter coming from a room, there is a good chance Charlotte is in there. Charlotte is known for her humor, her way with color and fabric, her precut kits, and a book, Surprise Yourself! She believes her hobby is quilting and her job is teaching others to enjoy it as much as she does. Her website is www.quiltmakersstudio.com

Charlotte says she works from a bag of quilts. She never knows exactly what will come out of her mouth. (It depends on what comes out of the bag.) Charlotte’s lecture will be humorous, light and yet full of information and real quilts. There are no slides or power point, lights are up and ideas are flowing. Many people cannot attend classes, and lectures are a great way for them to get a view of what quilting is all about. Questions are always welcome during the lecture. Bring friends, cameras and be ready to laugh!



Friday, October 7, 2016 Workshop: “Let Me Surprise You”

Finally, a class that you know you have brought the right things for! In this fun-filled class, a kit of CUT fabrics is furnished. This is a wonderful workshop for those who just want to sew and not have any cutting or thinking to do. This class is the most popular class Charlotte offers. It fills quickly and is a SURPRISE in more ways than one. It is a mystery type class. No one gets any hints and yet those who take the class will want to take another. Each class is a different quilt. Each kit is the same for our group. Come for a relaxed day of laughter and sewing.

The Guild has chosen a medium sized quilt. The kit fee, including precut fabrics, is \$100, to be paid to the instructor at the time of the class.

Saturday, October 8, 2016 Workshop: "Surprise Yourself" (with your own design)

This workshop will use the techniques for simple design, cutting and sewing techniques from Charlotte's new book *Let Me Surprise You*, which was written with her good friend, Debbie Caffrey. Using easy units and an artistic eye you will be creating your own designs as well as not needing the crazy directions often found in patterns and books. With this freedom you can easily see how many quilts are broken down and put back together again!

Certain patterns are easier than others and using basic units you will begin to create instead of just copy. This class is full of information, real quilts and real solutions to everyday problems in quilt making. The book is not required for the class, but it is a great source. November 3, 2016

Cover's For Kids Evening at the Guild.

Join us for the November Guild meeting to work on Covers for Kids! We will be doing "string piecing" and learning a few different ways to sew them, lay the blocks out, and finish the tops. 2015-16 Record Year of Giving

The 2015-16 was a record year for Covers for Kids! The Guild set a goal of 500 quilts. Members exceeded this goal by 14% ! We made 70 more quilts – 25% over last year. Thank you Rhonda Anderson and Mary Howard for your leadership in helping the Guild make a difference for kids.



2016 CFK Challenge

This year winners for the Covers For Kids Challenge were selected by guild members at the September meeting. Several members commented on how tough the decision was. Winners for this year's challenge are First Place, **Dianne Cronenberg**, Second Place, **Sue Holland** and Third Place, **Mary Howard**. A big thank you to all who participated! Your willingness to take the challenge continues to make our Guild special.

Goal for 2016-17

This year we set an ambitious goal of 600 quilts and we are off to a great start.

In September, we gave 14 quilts each to Dallas Children's Advocacy Center and Vogel Alcove plus 4 quilts to the Ronald McDonald House.

September's workshop winner is **Nancy Netherland**. Nancy is receiving a voucher for a free guild workshop of her choice. Nancy helps Covers For Kids by attending the CFK workshops and delivering quilts to Quilt Country for quilting. Thank you Nancy for all you do for CFK!

CFK WORKSHOPS

CFK Workshops have a new home: the Hobby Lobby on Highway 78/Lavon Dr. in Garland. It is two doors down from the old Hancock Fabrics we were using. To find the classroom, turn right immediately after entering the second set of doors to the store. Please, if you shop at this Hobby Lobby, make a point to express your appreciation for the use of their classroom for CFK workshops. If you are interested in trying out a Covers of Kids workshop, let Rhonda Anderson abusyquilter@tx.rr.com know so you can be put on her email list.

We add borders, turning too small quilt tops into just the right size. We also make backs. Not hard work at all, but very much needed. You bring your sewing machine and basic sewing/quilting supplies (scissors, seam ripper, rotary cutter, etc.) We supply the quilt tops, fabric, thread, cutting mats, irons and ironing boards (and sometimes someone to do all the pressing). We promise lots of fun, laughs and you may even learn a new quilt trick. You will leave knowing you have helped a child or teen have a brighter tomorrow.

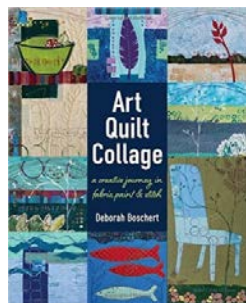

September Lesson of the Month: Quilted Christmas Ornaments (presented by Mary Mason)

This month's lesson was a creative way of making Christmas ornaments using 3" Styrofoam balls and 2 ½ " squares of fabric.

President Cindy Matthews called the meeting to order at 7:16 pm. New members and guests were acknowledged by standing. Cindy then asked the audience to turn to their neighbor and answer the question, "Who do you like to quilt with and why?"

Cindy then welcomed the new Board members and announced that the Guild is still in need of volunteers, both for the Guild as a whole and for the show. Openings are listed in the newsletter.

Linda Bartley (outgoing 7th VP Education): If you have signed up for a name tag over the past year and a half, they are on the table in the back. You can also sign up for one there as well.

Martha Wolf (6th VP Show): Most of the Show Committee positions are filled, but there are a couple of important positions open. One of these is heading up the Guild store; it is a major source of income for the Guild. Others are listed in the newsletter. Please contact Martha if you are interested.

Sherrie Tootle (3rd VP Programs & Workshops): There's been a change in the workshop fee structure to \$40 for members and \$45 for non-members. The Baker's Dozen will continue -- once you have attended 12 workshops, the 13th will be free.

Also, volunteers are needed to help Sherrie with the programs and workshops. This could be as simple as making hotel reservations for the speaker, picking them up at the airport, making sure they get to the guild meeting or workshop and then back to their hotel, taking them to lunch or dinner, etc. This is a way to earn reduced workshop fees.

The October workshop with Charlotte Angotti still has several spots open in both the Friday and Saturday workshops.

Bonnie Ambrose (1st VP Community Service) announced that 570 quilts were donated to the charities the Guild supports during the 2015-2016 year. This was 14% over the goal and 25% more than the previous year! For the 2016-2017 the goal is 600 quilts. The next Covers for Kids workshop will be September 24 at the Hobby Lobby near FireWheel. Tonight's workshop voucher goes to Nancy Netherland.

Rhonda Anderson reminded the membership that if you are interested in the CFK workshop, please let her know and she will put you on the email list. The Challenge Quilts are going to be voted on tonight by the membership. They are laid out on tables in the back. Please take a piece of paper and vote for your favorite! The winners will be announced at the end of the meeting.

Judy Kriehn (Membership): Over 300 members have renewed! Also, Judy Kriehn and Cindy Wells are chairing the Vendor Committee for the show. Vendor materials have been posted to the website. If you know of anyone who might be interested in being a vendor at the show next year, please direct them to our website.

Donna Petrick (TAQG, Quilt Show): Show entry forms are posted on the Guild's website. There are two pages for each entry. Take a close look at the categories as some have changed. The next TAQG meeting will be September 17. The special topic will be getting younger members into guilds. November's special meeting is on Programs.

Maria Hall is an Award Winning Freehand Longarm Quilter, who graduated from the Naval Academy, etc. Don't you love finding out what interesting backgrounds the stars of the quilting community have? Maria is also a fun, dynamic speaker.

About her presentation, "*One Block, 12 Quilts*," she says, "I challenged myself over the past year to take just one block and each month use that block to create a different quilt. Same block, completely unique quilts, from just changing color schemes, block settings, size or borders." She quilted them differently with different batting to show even more variation. The program encouraged us to look differently at patterns and blocks we did not immediately fall in love with to see the potential in ANY pattern. The program ignited our sewing fire and stirred our creative juices

There were two visitors, five new members, and a total attendance of 121.

There were 10 door prizes from The Old Craft Store, Quilt Country, and our generous members. Please thank them for their support of the guild when you visit them.

Cindy adjourned the meeting at 8:50 pm.

2017 Beneficiary: **Association for Independent Living (AFIL)**

Live Auction:

Saturday, March 11 • 1:30 p.m.

Our beneficiary, the AFIL, serves the needs of young adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities by providing a supportive residential living environment where each individual can learn vital independent living skills at their own pace. Ultimately, the goal is to enable these young adults to live independent lives, contribute to their community and build hope for their future.

AFIL was founded in 1979 with the belief that all adults have the right to experience life on their own, to the fullest extent of their ability.

Currently, their Training Dormitory houses up to 16 male and female young adults, aged 18 through 30. Residents in this program are no longer in school, but are able to work and volunteer in the community. Clients are screened to ensure that they and have the capability to live independently after completing training. Since 1979, more than 250 young adults have graduated and moved on to live independently.

Auction proceeds will be used to support mastering these independent living objectives:

- Cooking
- Cleaning and Maintaining a Home
- Money Management
- Hygiene
- Proper Social Etiquette
- Job Seeking Skills
- Safety
- Self-Advocacy/
Advocating for Others
- Leadership

How Can You Help?

You can help to make the auction an exciting event by

- Donating one (or more!) of your quilted creations
- Purchasing one or more of the small works of quilted art - either by submitting a proxy bid before the auction or at the live auction
- Encouraging friends and neighbors to bid

Members of the Guild may turn in their donation forms and quilts at the general meetings or mail them to one

of the auction co-chairmen.

The Quilter's Guild of Dallas, Inc. is a non-profit organization so your donation to the Guild is tax-deductible. However, your deduction for quilt donation is typically limited to material costs only. In other words, you cannot deduct "fair market value."

That said, following the auction, a receipt in the amount of the auctioned price of your donation will be mailed to you.

Rules & Guidelines

- 1** Your quilt must represent a full-sized quilt. It need not be "to scale," but must be scaled down.
- 2** Maximum size for a finished miniature quilt will be 25" square (no one side of a quilt can be larger than 25").
- 3** Interior blocks can be no larger than 4". Please note that exceptions are made for original designs, wholecloth, art quilts and medallion quilts.
- 4** Designs using fusible products are acceptable, but raw edges of fabric must be appropriately secured; quilting stitches, satin-stitching, or embellishments are examples.
- 5** DO NOT use fabric paint(s) and/or pens to simulate stitching or otherwise "shortcut" the quilting process.
- 6** A sleeve must be sewn to the top of the back of the quilt. The finished sleeve must be 2.5" wide by the width of the quilt.

- 8** ALL donations for the live auction must be received by **February 17, 2017**.
- 9** An entry form must accompany each submitted quilt. Please include as much information about your quilt as possible, to give the auctioneer "selling points" to use during the sale of your quilt. Feel free to attach an additional sheet of paper if needed.
