

Frieda Anderson - Flooded With Color - Saturday, September 9, 2017



Color is one of the reasons we love quilting, and achieving the abundance and variety of color is one reason we dye our own fabrics. The most dependable, light-fast and wash-fast dyes used by the industry are Procion MX Fiber Reactive Dyes, the same dyes used in this workshop. Participants will learn the techniques and dye formulas of 48 shades, introducing the flood of color that can be achieved with this easy dyeing method.

Supply list for this class:

\$20 Kit fee includes, dye and chemicals, face mask and gloves.

Participants are responsible for:

- Old clothes, comfortable shoes, an apron and washcloth.
- **48 small lidded** disposable plastic containers, such as Gladware®, or small sandwich size zip-lock® plastic bags. These will each hold a quarter yard of fabric.
- 1 box of gallon ziplock bags
- **48 quarter yards of PFD (Prepared For Dye)** or pre-washed white cotton fabric.
- *1 Bucket, 1 dishpan and 1 plastic bowl to dip your hands in*
- 3 quart containers with a wide mouth and lid, preferable NOT glass
- a set of measuring cups
- a set of measuring spoons. *(These can be bought at the dollar store.)*
- 4 large garbage bags
- old newspapers
- **extra** prewashed fabrics to dye in the afternoon – cotton, silk, rayon, t-shirts, socks....
- A box or laundry basket lined in plastic. The plastic containers with dyed fabric will be placed in this for the trip home in your car.
- a roll of paper towels
